## Eligibility & Licenses:

All skiers in the Midget category and above must possess a current CCC, FIS or other National Ski Federation racing license to register. If a skier is licensed by both FIS and CCC, both license numbers must be listed on the registration. CCC has introduced a Development License for midgets this season. This will allow midgets to earn Canada Points in midget categories. Skiers not licensed by FIS, CCC or other National Ski Federation, must purchase a CCC day license during registration at a cost of \$5 per day.

#### \*\*\* only skiers with FIS licenses are eligible to receive cash prizes \*\*\*

Seeding:

Seeding will be in accordance with <u>Section 6.9 of the Haywood NorAm Series Technical Package - 2015-16 Season</u>. For all open competitions, the Junior Men and Senior Men categories and the Junior Women and Senior Women categories will be combined for seeding purposes and run as a single open class.

The current CPL for both distance and sprint competitions will be used. Foreign skiers will be seeded with reference to their Canadian points. Midget skiers holding a CCC racing licence will receive preferred seeding in all races.

Registration:

<u>Late registrations</u> may be permitted at the discretion of the jury until midnight PST on Feb. 15<sup>th</sup> and will incur a penalty fee of \$50 per race. Late registrants will not be seeded.

Entry deadline: All registration closes February 15th at midnight PST

**Refund Policy:** Competitors who withdraw for medical reasons will be given a refund less

administrative fees provided notice and medical documentation are submitted to the Competition Secretary before the entry deadline. After entry deadline, no refunds will be given unless the event is cancelled. If the event is cancelled, refunds will be provided to all competitors less administrative fees and incurred event expenses.







#### **Cancellation Policy:**

Any change in the event location will be posted as early as it is known on the Caledonia Nordic Ski Club <u>event website</u>. Where possible a decision on event cancellation or change of site will be made by CCC no less than one week prior to the event in consultation with the organizing committee, the CCC Race Director and the Technical Delegate. Where possible a suitable alternative site will be identified at the time of cancellation.

# Notice of Doping Control:

Participants at the 2016 Haywood NorAm/Buff Sprints Western Championship must be aware that doping control tests may be conducted by the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) on a random basis in accordance with the Canadian Anti-Doping Program. To avoid an inadvertent positive test and the consequences of an anti-doping rule violation, athletes are encouraged to take the following steps:

- Check the Global DRO (<u>www.globaldro.com</u>) to determine if any prescription or over-the-counter medications or treatments that are banned by the WADA Prohibited List.
- Review medical exemptions requirements (<u>www.cces.ca/medical</u>) if you require the use of a banned medication for a legitimate medical reason.
- Do not use supplements, or take precautions prior to doing so. Supplement products cannot be verified by the CCES or in the Global DRO. A lack of industry and government regulation makes it impossible to confirm their ingredients. Read more: www.cces.ca/supplements

Awards:

NorAm and top three Junior Men and Women awards will be presented onsite following each day's Open Category race. Award presentations to the top three finishers in each of the other categories will also take place onsite after the races.

Cash prizes will be given to the top five finishers in the Open Class plus the top U23 finisher. *Only skiers with FIS licenses are eligible for cash prizes*.

Teck Northern Cup Awards will be presented following each day's races shortly after the finish of the last category.

Western Canadian Points:

All official race categories, midget through open senior are eligible for the Championships rankings. Western Canada Championship SWIX/Fisher Cup will be given to Divisions only (not individuals). The division aggregate will be based on the top 3 racers per Division in each category. The NorAm points system is used for scoring. Points will be awarded for all races. Skier affiliation will be with their host club.

**BC Cup Points:** 

Competitors in the Teck Northern Cup Races on Feb 20 and 21 can earn points towards the aggregate awards for the overall Teck BC Cup Series.

**Protest Procedure:** 

Protest forms will be available in the Race Office. Protests must be made in writing, submitted to the Competition Secretary within 15 minutes of posting of unofficial results and accompanied by a \$50 CDN fee.

Courses/ Maps:

All courses will be marked and tracks set on Wednesday Feb 18<sup>th</sup>. Course maps are now posted on event website. Printed copies will be available at the Otway Nordic Centre by noon on Wednesday Feb 17<sup>th</sup>.

Weather:

Current onsite weather conditions and temperatures can be viewed via the <u>Otway webcam</u>.

Weather Underground provides <u>forecasts</u> and <u>history</u> from the weather station in the stadium.

Other sources for local weather are The Weather Channel – 50 on Cable TV, Environment Canada taped Weather reports at 250-561-6912 and online on at the Government of Canada weather page for Prince George







### Warm up/ Wax testing:

Warm up/cool down and glide testing areas are located near the stadium. Testing for grip wax is permitted on course; note though that the course will be closed 5 minutes before the start of competition.

# CCBC Glide Waxing Protocol:

#### for competitors in the Midget and younger categories:

Cross Country BC respectfully requests all coaches, wax technicians, and parents abide by a self-governed protocol while waxing skis for athletes racing in the Midget age categories and younger. This request applies to all local, regional and provincial events taking place in British Columbia (e.g. club races, loppets, regional cup races, BC Cup races, BC Championships, BC Midget Championships and the BC Winter Games). This request also applies to athletes traveling to BC from out-of-province or out-of-country. The recommended glide waxing protocol is as follows:

- Non-Fluoro (NF) or Low Fluoro (LF) glide waxes ARE permitted
- Medium Fluoro (MF) or High Fluoro (HF) glide waxes are NOT permitted
- Pure Fluoro glide waxes (powders, pucks, blocks and liquid) are NOT permitted
- Cold weather powder additives and hardeners are NOT permitted

The adherence to this protocol is self-governed and is the responsibility of the coaches, parents and wax technicians.

#### Wax trailers:

Approximately 1800 sq. feet of secure, heated and ventilated waxing space (trailers), adjacent to the cross country stadium, will be provided. Each Division/NST/NDC will have a heated and secure wax area as a base in balance with the size of team expected. There will also be area available adjacent to the team trailers for personal tents to be set up as supplemental ski preparation space. Temporary power outlets will also be available along the biathlon fence behind the wax trailers. Limited space in the lower parking may be available for team trailers/wax trucks, etc.

A **key deposit of \$100 cash or cheque** will be collected on the training days during Race Office or Rental shop hours.

#### **Coaches please note:**

We ask that each Division/NST/NDC (or other entity expecting to attend with a team greater than 15 skiers) provide to the Competition Secretary, an estimate of team size by January 22nd to assist the OC with allocation of wax facility space. We also ask that Divisional coaches collaborate amongst themselves to provide cumulative estimates — excluding NDC's & NST skiers or major teams. We will do our best to accommodate athlete's needs within our means.







Trail passes: Official training - trail fees are included in registration, and passes may be picked up in

the Rental Office during open hours.

Unofficial training - for non Caledonia Nordic members, trail passes must be purchased

at the Rental Office. Cash, credit and debit cards are accepted.

**Facilities:** A heated day lodge with First Aid facility and indoor washrooms is at the race site.

Additional portable toilets are located close to the parking and stadium areas.

**Food Services:** <u>Finish line</u>: Save On Foods will be providing snacks and Gatorade.

<u>Concession</u>: Save On Foods will be serving soup, chili, baked goods and hot beverages during race days. Proceeds from concession sales will be donated in support of BC

Children's Hospital.
