


Cold Snap Challenges Teck Kootenay Cup 1 & 2

The Fernie Nordic Ski Club hosted Teck Kootenay Cup #1 & 2 plus the BC Winter Games Trials for Zone 1 on the weekend of December 30th-31st. Athletes from Golden, Kimberley, Invermere, Nelson, Rossland and as far away as Alberta, Ontario and Montana competed in the races.



The extreme cold on both race days necessitated some changes to the race times and course. On Saturday the PeeWee category was shortened to 1km and the Masters and Open categories were shortened to 7.7km. The Sunday race start was delayed by two hours to allow the temperature to get up to the range allowable for Teck Kootenay Cup races. On that day the PeeWee category was shortened to 1km, the Midget category to 2km, the Juvenile category to 3.4km, the Junior category to 5km, and the Masters and Open categories to 7.7km.
