REGISTRATION: Registration is online at <u>Zone4.ca</u> fees payable by credit card only. GST will be added at check out. *Coaches and Managers should register (no fee) to receive notices. * Registrants are responsible to verify the accuracy of their entries; any

corrections should be reported to the Competition Secretary.

Para Nordic and Special Olympic categories will be included as requested. Contact the Competition Secretary for more information or if you have trouble with the registration process.

Please note for **Canada Winter Games (CWG) selection purposes**, Juniors must compete in the Open Men/Women's category for the Individual Sprint competition (Saturday), the Open Men/Women's category for the interval start competition (Sunday) to be eligible to qualify.

- RACE ENTRY:
 Deadline
 for registration is Wednesday December 26th 11:59pm PST

 Late entries may be accepted until 3pm PST Dec 27th.
 A \$20 per race surcharge will apply.
- **REFUND POLICY:** Competitors who withdraw for medical reasons will be refunded, less administrative fees, provided notice and medical documentation are submitted to the Competition Secretary before the entry deadline. After entry deadline, no refunds will be given unless the event is cancelled and then, refunds will be provided to all competitors less administrative fees and incurred event expenses. There are no refunds for day of race cancellations due to weather.
- **SPRINT FORMATS:** The Sprint race will offer a qualification round (15 second intervals) for all age categories. The qualification round will be followed by FIS elimination heats. All skiers will be given the opportunity to compete in a minimum of the qualification round and one heat.

Heats will begin as soon as the organizers can prepare for them and will be offered for age categories. Small categories may be combined.

- LICENCES: Competitors in Midget, Juvenile, Junior and Open categories must have one of the following valid licences to be eligible to race in the BC Cup.
 - CCC race licence
 - CCC day licence (\$5 per each day of racing)

CCC race licenses must be ordered in advance from CCC at: <u>http://www.cccski.com/Events/License-Applications.aspx</u> and cannot be issued by the race organizers. CCC race licences will be verified to ensure that they are current. Competitors in the **Bantam or younger, and Masters categories do not need a licence** to compete, but must be members in good standing of a CCC/CCBC club.

SEEDING: Competitors in the Senior and Junior Men categories and those in the Senior and Junior Women will be combined for seeding purposes and will compete as a single Open competition. The categories will be separated into Open and Junior for results and awards/prizes. The current Canada Points List (CPL) for both distance and sprint competitions will be used.

NEW from 2017-18 If two or more age categories of the same gender are skiing a common distance (for example, a 5km distance for both Juvenile Girls and Junior Girls) they need to be seeded together/combined for CPL point calculation purposes. The categories would then be combined in the start list but separated again in the results.

Categories that do not require a race licence will not be seeded, start order will be by random draw.

PROVISIONS:Races will be cancelled or postponed if temperature conditions are
unsuitable at start time. Notice will be posted on the event webpage.

With air temperatures below -20°C (temperature measured at the coldest point of the course and without wind factor) and competition distances less than or equal to 15 km, the Jury must postpone or cancel the competition.

For skiers born 2006 and later, with air temperatures below -15C (temperature measured at the coldest part of the course and without a wind factor), the Jury must postpone or cancel the competition.

CCBC Low-fluoro Glide Waxing Protocol: Implementation date: January 1, 2017

Cross Country BC respectfully requests all coaches, athletes, wax technicians and parents to abide by a self-governed protocol while waxing skis for identified races taking place in British Columbia. This also applies to coaches, athletes, wax technicians and parents traveling to British Columbia from out-of-province or out-of-country.

Low-Fluoro glide waxing protocol:

- Structure tools ARE permitted
- Non-Fluoro (NF) or Low Fluoro (LF) glide waxes ARE permitted
- Medium Fluoro (MF) or High Fluoro (HF) glide waxes are NOT permitted
- Pure Fluoro glide waxes (powders, pucks, blocks and liquids) are NOT permitted
- Cold weather powder additives and hardeners are NOT permitted

Adherence to this protocol is self-governed and is the responsibility of coaches, athletes, parents and wax technicians.

WAXING: Outdoor waxing outlets with enough electrical power for waxing purposes are available at the race site. Teams must supply their own tents. Indoor waxing areas will be made available if necessary due to cold. No Heated Fluorocarbon Waxes to be applied indoors



WARM UP/ WAX TESTING:	Warm up and wax testing areas are located near to the waxing facilities near the stadium. There is a designated wax testing area on course. A map will be posted to the website and at the club.				
RACE COURSES:	All courses will be marked, and tracks set for 9 am on Friday Dec 28th.				
COURSE MAPS:	Course maps will be posted to the event website as soon as they becom available and at the Otway Nordic Centre by 1pm Friday Dec 28 th .				
FACILITIES:	A day lodge with a First Aid facility and indoor washrooms is on site. Portable toilets are located close to the parking and stadium area.				
FOOD SERVICES:	Finish line: Snacks and Gatorade sponsored by Save-On-Foods				
	<u>Concession</u> : there will be a concession on site serving hot foods, beverages and baked goods in the Rotary Lodge.				
TRAIL FEES:	Trail fees are waived for all competitors and coaches on each race day and the official training day Friday, December 28 th .
