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**SPRINT FORMATS:** The Sprint race will offer a qualification round (15 second intervals) for all age categories. The qualification round will be followed FIS elimination heats.

Heats will begin as soon as the organizers can prepare for them. Heats will be offered for age categories and small categories may be combined.

### LICENCES: Competitors in Midget, Juvenile, Junior and Open categories must have one of the following valid licences to be eligible to race in the BC Cup.

- CCC race licence
- CCC day licence (\$5 per each day of racing)

CCC race licenses must be ordered in advance from CCC at: <u>http://www.cccski.com/Events/License-Applications.aspx</u> and cannot be issued by the race organizers. CCC race licences will be verified to ensure that they are current. Competitors in the **Bantam or younger, and Masters categories do not need a licence** to compete, but must be members in good standing of a CCC/CCBC club.

**SEEDING:** Competitors in the Senior and Junior Men categories and those in the Senior and Junior Women will be combined for seeding purposes and will compete as a single Open competition. The categories will be separated into Open and Junior for results and awards/prizes. The current Canada Points List (CPL) for both distance and sprint competitions will be used.

**NEW IN 2017-18** If two or more age categories of the same gender are skiing a common distance (for example, a 5km distance for both Juvenile Girls and Junior Girls) they need to be seeded together/combined for CPL point calculation purposes. The categories would then be combined in the start list, but separated again in the results.

Categories that do not require a race licence will not be seeded, start order will be by random draw.

**DRAW:** Order of start will be determined by computer draw on the evening of Thursday February 1, 2018.

**START LISTS:** Start lists for the Saturday race will be available by noon, Friday February 2nd on Zone4.ca and at the Otway Nordic Centre. Start lists for Sunday's race will be available after awards presentations on Saturday.

**RACE OFFICE** The Race Office will be located on the lower level of the Rotary Nordic Lodge, with entry through the Rental Office.

# COLD WEATHERRaces will be cancelled or postponed if temperature conditions are<br/>unsuitable at start time. Notice will be posted on the event webpage.

With air temperatures below -20°C (temperature measured at the coldest point of the course and without wind factor) and competition distances less than or equal to 15 km, the Jury must postpone or cancel the competition.

For skiers born 2005 and later, with air temperatures below -15C (temperature measured at the coldest part of the course and without a wind factor), the Jury must postpone or cancel the competition.

### CCBC Low-fluoro Glide Waxing Protocol: Implementation date: January 1, 2017

Cross Country BC respectfully requests all coaches, athletes, wax technicians and parents to abide by a self-governed protocol while waxing skis for identified races taking place in British Columbia. This also applies to coaches, athletes, wax technicians and parents traveling to British Columbia from out-of-province or out-of-country.

### Low-Fluoro glide waxing protocol:

- Structure tools ARE permitted
- Non-Fluoro (NF) or Low Fluoro (LF) glide waxes ARE permitted
- Medium Fluoro (MF) or High Fluoro (HF) glide waxes are NOT permitted
- Pure Fluoro glide waxes (powders, pucks, blocks and liquids) are NOT permitted
- Cold weather powder additives and hardeners are NOT permitted

# The above low-fluoro waxing protocol applies to the following races/age categories:

 At BC Cup races (including the BC Championships) that are not combined with a NorAm or CCC/Canada Games selection races: the low-fluoro protocol applies to ALL age categories

#### Note:

If an athlete chooses to "race up" and compete in a different age category, the athlete is governed by the low-fluoro protocol in place for the category into which he/she races up.

# Adherence to this protocol is self-governed and is the responsibility of coaches, athletes, parents and wax technicians.

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WAXING: Outdoor waxing outlets with sufficient electrical power for waxing purposes are available at the race site. Teams must supply their own tents. Indoor waxing areas will be made available if necessary due to cold. No Heated Fluorocarbon Waxes to be applied indoors

WARM UP/Warm up and wax testing areas are located near to the waxingWAX TESTING:Facilities near the stadium.No wax testing allowed on the course during the competition.

- **RACE COURSES:** All courses will be marked and tracks set for 9 am on Friday Feb 2<sup>nd</sup>.
- **COURSE MAPS**: Course maps will be posted to the event website as soon as they become available and will be posted at the Otway Nordic Centre by Friday Feb 2nd at 1pm.
- **FACILITIES**: A day lodge with a First Aid facility and indoor washrooms is on site. Portable toilets are located close to the parking and stadium area.
- FOOD SERVICES: Finish line: Snacks and Gatorade sponsored by Save-On-Foods

<u>Concession</u>: <u>Ohh Chocolate Café & More</u> will have a concession on site serving hot foods, beverages and baked goods in the Rotary Lodge.

- **TRAIL FEES:** Trail fees are waived for all competitors and coaches on each race day and the official training day Friday, February 2<sup>nd</sup>.
- **AWARDS:** Awards will be presented as follows:

• Ages 7 and under receive Teck participant ribbons at the finish line.

At the end of the competition day:

- 8 years Teck Ribbon for top 5 finishers; Teck participant for all others
- Ages 9-15: Teck medals for top 3 finishers, Teck ribbons for 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>
- Age 16-17: Club medals for top 3 finishers
- Medals for top three finishers in Junior, Open and Masters M/W categories
