CCC Officials Certification Program

This program consists of five steps from entry level through to international level. It includes technical delegate, event management and course conductor training as well as standard training for officials.

Level 1

An eight hour course that provides an overview of what a cross country ski competition is all about. The focus is on the duties of minor officials for both 'Olympic' style (interval start, mass start, pursuit start, individual sprint, team sprint and relay) and 'Loppet' style (mass participation) competitions.

Course fee for CCBC members: \$85.00

Course fee for non-members: \$160.00

Level 2

A 16 hour course that prepares officials for leadership roles on a competition committee at club, provincial and most national level races, including the BC Cup Series, BC Winter Games and loppets. The course covers all official race formats, rules and regulations, rule interpretation, electronic timing, all aspects of the results system and volunteer management.

Course fee for CCBC members: \$100.00

Course fee for non-members: \$200.00

Level 3

This is a 3.5 day course. It is designed to prepare an official to (1) effectively structure, staff and manage a competition committee at provincial through national level competitions, (2) perform any 'major' official role at the National Championship level, (3) perform the role of a provincial Technical Delegate at a provincial and national level races and (4) have a good understanding of CCC/FIS rules.

Independent Auditor's Report

To the Members of
Cross Country BC

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Cross Country BC (the "Organization"), which comprise the statement of financial position as at March 31, 2019, and the statements of operations, changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies (collectively referred to as the "financial statements").

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Organization as at March 31, 2019 and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations ("ASNPO").

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards ("Canadian GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the Organization in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in Canada, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with ASNPO, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Organization's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Organization or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Organization's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.



1. Status and purpose of the organization

Cross Country BC (the "Association") is a not-for-profit organization incorporated under the Societies Act of British Columbia and accordingly is exempt from income tax under provisions of the Income Tax Act provided certain requirements of the Income Tax Act are met. It is not a registered charity that can issue tax receipts. Its purpose is to provide provincial programming for the continuous development of cross-country skiing programs, recreational through to competitive, to a broad cross section of the community.

2. Significant accounting policies

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with Canadian Accounting Standards for Not-For-Profit Organizations in Part III of the CPA Canada Handbook ("ASNPO"). The Association's significant accounting policies are as follows:

(a) Revenue recognition

The Association follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions, which include donations and government grants.

Unrestricted contributions are recorded as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured. Government grants approved but not received at the end of an accounting period are accrued. Restricted contributions are recognized in revenue in the period in which the expenses relating to the project are incurred.

Restricted contributions received for the acquisition of tangible capital assets are deferred and amortized to revenue on the same basis that the related tangible capital assets are amortized.

Revenue from memberships and programs are recognized when the services are provided or the goods are sold. Marketing and other revenue are recognized when the services of goods are provided.

Endowment contributions are recognized as direct increases in net assets.

(b) Short-term investments

Short-term investments consist of investments in money market or other short-term instruments with a maturity of more than 90 days and less than one year.

(c) Tangible capital assets

Purchased tangible capital assets are recorded at cost less accumulated amortization. Contributed tangible capital assets are recorded at fair value at the date of contribution. Assets acquired under capital leases are amortized over the estimated life of the assets or over the lease term, as appropriate. Repairs and maintenance costs are charged to expense. Betterments, which extend the estimated life of an asset, are capitalized. When a tangible capital asset no longer contributes to the Association's ability to provide services, its carrying amount is written down to its residual value.

2. Significant accounting policies (continued)

(c) Tangible capital assets (continued)

Tangible capital assets are amortized on a declining balance basis using the following annual rates:

(d) Use of estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in accordance with ASNPO requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the year. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Significant financial statement items that require the use of estimates are as follows: the estimated useful lives and recoverable values of tangible capital assets. These estimates are reviewed periodically, and, as adjustments become necessary, they are reported in the statement of operations in the year in which they become known.

(e) Financial instruments

Financial instruments are recorded at fair value on initial recognition. Freestanding derivative instruments that are not in a qualifying hedging relationship and equity instruments that are quoted in an active market are subsequently measured at fair value. All other financial instruments are subsequently recorded at cost or amortized cost, unless management has elected to carry the instruments at fair value. The Association has not elected to carry any such financial instruments at fair value.

Transaction costs incurred on the acquisition of financial instruments measured subsequently at fair value are expensed as incurred. All other financial instruments are adjusted by transaction costs incurred on acquisition and financing costs, which are amortized using the straight-line method.

Financial assets measured at cost or amortized cost are tested for impairment if there are indications of possible impairment. The amount of the write-down is recognized in net income. A previously recognized impairment loss may be reversed to the extent of the improvement, either directly or by adjusting the allowance account, provided it is no greater than the amount that would have been reported at the date of the reversal had the impairment loss not been recognized previously. The amount of the reversal is recognized in excess (deficiency) of revenues over expenses for the year.

(f) Contributed services

A substantial number of volunteers contribute a significant amount of their time each year to assist the Association in carrying out its services and activities. Due to the difficulty in determining the fair value for these services, they are not recognized in the financial statements.

3. Gaming activities

Revenue earned from the Community Gaming grant is used to purchase goods and services required to provide the various programs offered by the Association during the year.

Funds held in the Association's gaming account are restricted for these future programs, and have therefore been classified as restricted cash. The balance in this account at March 31, 2019 is \$544 (\$541 in 2018).

(b) From time to time, the Association is brought forth as defendant in various lawsuits. The Association reviews its exposure to any potential litigation for which it would not be covered by insurance and assesses whether a successful claim against the Association would materially affect the financial statements of the Association. The Association is not aware of any claims brought against it that if not defended successfully, would result in a material change to these financial statements.

7. Directors' and employees' remuneration

No directors of the Association were remunerated for the fiscal year ending 2019 (none in 2018).

For the fiscal year ended 2019, the Association did not pay any remuneration to employees and contractors for services in excess of \$75,000 in aggregate (none in 2018).

8. Financial risks and concentration of risk

(a) Credit risk

The maximum credit risk exposure for all of the Association is the carrying value of cash, restricted cash, accounts receivable and short-term investments. Cash, restricted cash and short-term investments are held with reputable major financial institutions to limit the credit risk exposure. Credit risk arising from accounts receivable is mitigated as the Association receives the majority of its funding from government associations and its members.

(b) Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Association will be unable to fulfil its obligations on a timely basis or at a reasonable cost. The Association manages its liquidity risk by monitoring its operating requirements. The Association prepares budget and cash forecasts to ensure it has sufficient funds to fulfill its obligations. There has been no significant change to the risk exposures from 2018.

9. Economic dependence

A significant portion of the Association's revenues are derived from direct and indirect funding from the Province of British Columbia and the federal government. In 2019, these revenues represented 37% (37% in 2018) of total revenue.

10. Corresponding figures

Certain corresponding financial statement figures have been reclassified for financial statement presentation purposes to conform with the current year's presentation.
