Telemark Nordic Centre Race Courses Certified to Top Competition Standards

West Kelowna, BC — Telemark Nordic Club in West Kelowna, BC has successfully completed a year-long project to upgrade the club's cross-country ski race courses and has been awarded Federation International de Ski (FIS) certification. This means that the club meets international race standards and will be able to attract high level races and elite cross-country ski athletes from around the world to the Okanagan.

The new certification will begin paying off February 8-10, 2019 when Telemark hosts the <u>Western</u> <u>Canadian Championships</u>. They anticipate welcoming over 500 of the most competitive cross-country skiers along with their coaches and support teams from across Canada and western United States.

Elite international athletes who have never raced at Telemark will be confident that the race courses are comparable to the World Cup courses they usually race on because FIS has certified that Telemark's race courses are fast, challenging, and safe.

Mike Norton, FIS Homologation Inspector for Cross Country Canada, was impressed with the new race courses at Telemark, adding "The 5.0 km race course is one of the best and most challenging courses in the country."

James Williams and Tim Mayer, long-time Telemark Club members and Masters racers themselves, are responsible for most of the work on the project. According to James, "We are really pleased with how everything turned out. The athletes are going to love these courses. It is not just about racing, though. Our day-to-day recreational skiers also benefit from the course upgrades."
