- ELIGIBILITY:** Skiers must be a member in good standing of a CCC/CCBC club.
Ski licences are not required.

Credit card payment is required.
- DEADLINE:** Deadline for entries is Thursday, January 31st, 2019 at 2359 hours

- START LISTS:** Start lists will be posted on Zone4 and will be available Sunday morning

AWARDS: An award ceremony will be held on site following the races. It is tentatively scheduled for 1400 hours.

INDIVIDUAL AWARDS:

CATEGORY (age as of December 31, 2017)	AWARDS
Pre-Atoms and Atoms (7 years and under; born 2011 & later)	Teck participant ribbons
PeeWee (8 year olds or born in 2009) to Juvenile (15 year olds or born in 2003)	Teck medals for top 3 finishers Teck ribbons for 4 th and 5 th finishers
Junior (16 year olds or born in 2002) to Masters 60+	Omineca medals for top 3 finishers in each category

TEAM AGGREGATE AWARDS: Club points are accumulated for each skier who successfully completes the race. Cross Country BC will post the aggregate points earned by participating clubs as they accumulate throughout the season. The winner of the Club Aggregate Award will be the club with the most points. The Club Aggregate Award will be presented immediately after the final race of the season has been completed.

Details	Points
Number of participants in a mass start race	1 point per participant
Top 5 placing in each category	7 (for first place) then 6, 5, 4, 3 points
If there are less than 5 competitors in a category, the points will still begin at 7 points for 1 st place, 6 points for 2 nd place etc.	

FACILITIES: Jean Paulson Lodge – both indoor and outdoor washroom facilities are available.

WAXING: A heated waxing cabin is available for use with a limited number of electrical outlets for irons. A warm up area will be available in the vicinity of the race start.

Cross Country BC respectfully request all coaches, athletes, wax technicians and parents to abide by a self-governed protocol while waxing skis for athletes in all age categories at all Regional Cup races. This protocol also applies to coaches, athletes, wax technicians and parents traveling to British Columbia from out-of-province or out-of-country.

Low-fluoro glide waxing protocol:

- Structure tools ARE permitted
- Non-Fluoro (NF) or Low Fluoro (LF) glide waxes are permitted
- Medium Fluoro (MF) or High Fluoro (HF) glide waxes are NOT permitted
- Pure Fluoro glide waxes (powders, pucks, blocks and liquids) are NOT permitted
- Cold weather powder additives and hardeners are NOT permitted

COURSES: The courses will be marked the night before the race. Maps are available on the club website.

CONCESSION: A concession serving a hot lunch, snacks and beverages will be available inside the Jean Paulson Lodge. Entry fees include soup, bun and a drink for all racers in addition to race refreshments.

ACCOMMODATION: Motel accommodations are available in the Village of Burns Lake.

CANCELLATION: There are no refunds of any kind once a racer registers and then subsequently withdraws from the race or does not show up for the race.

If the organizers are required to cancel the race due to weather or any other unforeseen circumstances, then full refunds will be issued with the exception of any online processing fees.
