REGISTRATION: Registration is online only via **Zone4**. Fees payable by credit card only. GST will be

added at checkout.

Coaches and Managers should register (no fee) to receive notices.

Registrants are responsible to verify the accuracy of their entries. Any corrections

should be reported to the Competition Secretary.

RACE ENTRY: Deadline for registration is midnight on Wednesday, January 29th.

Late entries may be accepted until 3pm PST Jan 30th. A \$20 per race surcharge will apply.

REFUND POLICY:

Competitors who withdraw for medical reasons will be refunded, less administrative fees, provided notice and medical documentation are submitted to the Competition Secretary before the entry deadline. After entry deadline, no refunds will be given unless the event is cancelled and then, refunds will be provided to all competitors less administrative fees and incurred event expenses. There are no refunds for day of race cancellations due to weather.

SPRINT FORMATS:

The Sprint race will offer a qualification round (15 second intervals) for all age categories. The qualification round will be followed by FIS elimination heats. All skiers will be given the opportunity to compete in a minimum of the qualification round and one heat.

Heats will begin as soon as the organizers can prepare for them and will be offered for age categories. Small categories may be combined.

LICENSES:

Licenses are not required for U12 and younger or Masters competitors but competitors must be members in good standing of a Nordiq Canada/CCBC club.

Competitors in the **U14 through Senior categories** must hold one of the following valid licenses to be eligible to participate in either race.

- Nordiq Canada Race License
- FIS Race License
- Other National Ski License

Nordiq Canada Race Licenses must be ordered in advance from Nordiq Canada at: http://www.cccski.com/Events/License-Applications.aspx.

Competitors in the **U14 through Senior categories** who do not hold a valid license must purchase a Nordiq Canada Day License. The day license can be purchased during on-line registration for \$5 per day of racing.

SEEDING:

If two or more age categories of the same gender are skiing a common distance (with the exception of the Masters categories) they will be seeded together for CPL point calculation purposes. These categories will be combined in the start list but separated in the results.

Categories that do not require a race license will not be seeded, start order will be by random draw.

DRAW:

Order of start will be determined by computer draw on the evening of Thursday January 30th.

START LISTS:

Start lists for the Saturday's race will be posted on Zone4 and on site by noon on Friday, January 31st. Start lists for the Sunday's race will be posted on Zone4 and on site as soon as possible after Saturday's results are posted.

The Race Office will be located in the lower level of the Rotary Nordic Lodge with entry through the Rental Office.

(Individual pick up for heat bibs will be announced by category as soon as possible after the qualification round.)

Timing chips will be picked up near the start line. Athletes should allow sufficient time prior to their start.

COLD WEATHER PROVISIONS:

Races will be cancelled or postponed if temperature conditions are unsuitable at start time. Notice will be posted on the event webpage.

With air temperatures below -20°C (temperature measured at the coldest point of the course and without wind factor) and competition distances less than or equal to 15 km, the Jury must postpone or cancel the competition. With competition distances greater than 15 km and temperature less than -18°C without wind factor, the Jury must postpone or cancel the competition.

For skiers born in 2007 or later, with air temperatures below -15C (temperature measured at the coldest part of the course and without a wind factor), the Jury must postpone or cancel the competition.

WEATHER:

<u>Current on-site weather</u> conditions and temperatures can be found on the host club website. For local area conditions visit environment Canada <u>weather page for Prince George</u>.

WAXING:

Outdoor waxing outlets with enough electrical power for waxing purposes are available at the race site. Teams must supply their own tents. Indoor waxing areas will be made available if necessary due to cold.

No Heated Fluorocarbon Waxes to be applied indoors

CCBC Glide Wax Protocol:

Cross Country BC respectfully requests all coaches, athletes, wax technicians and parents to abide by a self-governed protocol while waxing skis for athletes in all age categories at all BC Cup races. This protocol also applies to coaches, athletes, wax technicians and parents traveling to British Columbia from out-of-province or out-of-country.

Low-fluoro glide waxing protocol:

- Structure tools ARE permitted.
- Non-Fluoro (NF) or Low Fluoro (LF) glide waxes ARE permitted.
- Medium Fluoro (MF) or High Fluoro (HF) glide waxes are NOT permitted.
- Pure Fluoro glide waxes (powders, pucks, blocks and liquids) are NOT permitted.
- Cold weather powder additives and hardeners are NOT permitted.

WARM UP/ WAX TESTING: Warm up and wax testing areas are provided. A map showing their locations will be posted to the website and at the club.

RACE COURSES: Courses will be marked and tracks set by 9am on Friday, Jan 31st.

COURSE MAPS: Course maps will be posted at the venue and on the event website as soon as they

become available and at the Otway Nordic Centre by pm on Friday, Jan 31st.

FACILITIES: A day lodge with First Aid facilities and indoor washrooms is on site.

FOOD & DRINKS: Finish Line: Snacks and Gatorade sponsored by Save-On Foods.

TRAIL FEES: Trail fees are waived for all competitors and coaches on each race day and the
