

Fernie Nordic Society: Growth and Development

- Society formed in 2006; First winter of programming in 2007
- Coaches: 16 qualified coaches, trained through national program
- 341 members this year

Nordic in an Alpine Community

- Heavy marketing of Fernie for downhill skiing: historically the main recreation for the community
- Addressing perceptions: "gnarly terrain" and "sick powder" vs "nerdic skiing"
- Lack of understanding around nordic trail development

Nordic Skiing on the rise

- Increasing excitement and involvement in the sport
- Close to 30 dedicated volunteers involved in events, kids programs, grooming, Board of Directors, etc.
- Local funding partners: 33 partners
- Identified need for a "home base" in order to facilitate growth

- Legacy of '87 BC Winter Games




Our Dream

Two Components:

Developing a Nordic Centre

- Commitment to a professional and informed process
- Completion of competitive RFP process to identify a trail designer
- Defined scope of work to guide the assessment process
- Selection of Reidar Zapf-Gilje




Bringing in expertise

- Reidar has designed over a dozen club ski trails in British Columbia
- Notable experience:
 - Involved in the development of recreational trails at Olympic Park
 - Design of the Paralympic Cross Country trails for the 2010 Olympic bid package
 - Review of the 2010 Olympic Centre nordic trails



Phase 1: Desíred Outcomes

- Identify land for trail development
- Identification of any land, drainage, hazard, risk or environmental concerns
- Compliance with trail standard guidelines for races of national scale
- Budget for build-out





Building Trails

- Ministry of Community, Sport and Development – Planning funds
- Resort Municipality Initiative: trail building funds
- Teck: trail building
- Private land owners: partners

Goal: Core trail system for 2014



Next steps: Keeping Momentum

- Ramp up fundraising and grant writing activities
- Engage and learn from other local clubs and their experiences
- Grow membership, volunteers and exposure to visitors to the community

Challenges.. HELP!

- Coaches: honorariums vs volunteer
- Admin: paid position?
- Biathlon adding complexity?
- Fundraisers off-season engagement and participation
